It was with great pride that I sent off our submissions for District Awards for PR and also Service and Advocacy. Special thanks to Di Bartel, Lesley Siegloff and Advocacy Committee. This has been a busy month for meetings. **Ellen Poyner** from NAPCAN came to meet **Di Lancaster, Di Bartel and myself** at my house. She was very interested in our Expect Respect projects and impressed by our new Powerpoint. She is willing to talk to our clubs about her Churchill Fellowship research on child abuse prevention measures in other countries.

At the Advocacy meeting I attended, **Di Bartel** volunteered to be our UN International Rep and is willing to organise an international evening for our September dinner meeting (UN International Day is 24 October, just before our 30<sup>th</sup> Celebration). She is studying International Relations and is well travelled. With her excellent written and communication skills, I am sure Di will develop this role for our club. *I was asked to write a uniform letter for members to send out to ask for cash donations or raffle prize to assist our fundraising efforts.*

I suggest members send me the replies they receive, I could then collate the various responses so that we get a fuller picture of this important bipartisan legislation.

We had the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the disappearance of Amelia Earhart this week. Photos have been found of someone resembling her on a Japanese occupied island. 1937 was five years before Japan entered the Second World War. The mystery continues .....

## 80 Years since the disappearance of Amelia Earhart

1. Amelia Earhart was born in Atchinson, Kansas on July 24<sup>th</sup> 1897
2. Amelia saw her first plane at a state fair when she was 10 years old.
3. During World War 1, Amelia became a nurse's aid in Toronto, Canada, to tend to wounded soldiers.
4. On December 28, 1920, pilot Frank Hawks gave Amelia her first ride in an airplane.
5. Amelia took her first flying lesson on January 3, 1921.
6. Amelia's first plane was a bright yellow Kinner Airster that she nicknamed "The Canary".
7. While living in Boston, Amelia wrote articles promoting flying in the local newspaper.
8. In 1932, Amelia developed flying clothes for the Ninety-Nines that were advertised in Vogue.
9. Although she referred to herself as "AE" Amelia became known as "Lady Lindy" after her first flight across the Atlantic.
10. During her 2,408 mile flight to become the first person to fly solo across the Pacific, Amelia enjoyed a cup of hot chocolate.

Many theories have been around since Amelia's disappearance, some just very recently, but her last sightings are still a mystery, and may never be know for sure.
