Zonta Combined Advocacy Meeting

On Saturday, 13 February I attended the Combined Advocacy Meeting, I thought as a "newbie" just to observe and learn what is going on, but there was no sitting back observing. Everyone was involved, with Katrine Hildyard facilitating. There were about 30 representatives from Adelaide, Adelaide Flinders, Adelaide Torrens, Mount Barker, Gawler, Fleurieu Peninsula, Noarlunga Southern Vales and the Riverland.

Chris Frick explained that the purpose of the meeting was to take workshops further. Feedback had been that workshop content had been valuable, but everyone went back to individual clubs and there was little follow up or coordination.

The need to focus on one issue was discussed. Katrine referred to the campaign of 125 years ago to give women the right to vote and how a group had focused on that one issue to get it passed.

In her opening comments, she quoted: "we stand on the shoulders of other women who have gone before us" and that Zontians show that drive and desire to lift each other up and advance the rights of women.

The discussion reflected on how to make change. How to turn awareness into action.

The meeting was broken into groups to discuss three questions:

- 1 What is the change you want to make, or what do you want to win?
- 2 What exactly does a win look like?
- 3 Is that change, that desire for that thing to be changed, is that widely and deeply felt? Would a lot of people support it?

The groups were asked to provide a Vision. Following discussion, the suggested vision was:

"To improve the political, social educational and economic issues for girls and women".

The four main agreed points that supported this were:

- Empowering women through advocacy and service 1)
- 2) Women's rights are human rights
- Lessening all violence against women and encouraging women to achieve 3)
- Changing the power structure where women and girls can have an equal voice and 4) place in

The combined responses led to the main issue that the group agreed could head a campaign being:

In five years, not one woman dies or is seriously injured from domestic violence in South Australia.

The following three issues were identified as enabling this:

- 1) Coercive control to be treated as seriously as domestic violence
- 2) Education
- Shifting Zonta from service to advocacy. 3)

It was identified that points 2 and 3 require more research.

One member identified the three As: Advocacy requires Action by All.



This issue is being added to the agenda for the next Area Workshop.

One member spoke of women safe police stations and the history of them in Argentina. A series by Jessica Hill will be run shortly on SBS and details will be forwarded for our information.

I enjoyed the afternoon and was pleased I had attended.
