



## **Birthing Kit Report**

The birthing kit program is once again growing with the wonderful support of our Zonta clubs. The board is united and working to secure our future humanitarian work.

We faced the financial and physical challenges of Covid19 and fires by becoming more innovative. The "Kits at Home" initiative allowed kits in smaller numbers to be made from home. Now as restrictions are being eased more supporters are holding more Assembly Days.

We now have the "Donate a Kit" option on our BKFA website where anyone who wishes to support us can donate money and kits will be made by ORANA a disability support service. We are showing our corporate socially responsibility by providing employment for people with disabilities.

If a club only has funds for 100 kits then they can make that donation. Everyone can still be involved in these times of limited fundraising.

We have addressed a criticism that the plastic is a pollutant in a developing country by ALL plastic in kits now being made from materials that biodegrade in soil. After years of research, it has taken to now for technology to enable this to be possible in a cost effective way.

### The Birthing Kit Report continued

We are also increasing our In-country kit making programs to reduce the carbon footprint created by our kit production in a country a long way from its destination use.

We are a humanitarian organisation showing we can also be environmentally responsible.

Be assured there will always be a need for many kits to be made in Australia by our Zonta supporters. The demand is huge and with COVID19 is only growing.

We will reach our target of having 130,000 kits made either at traditional assembly days, or in country by our partners or by our corporate disability support service.

To say it has been an interesting time for everyone is an understatement.

I ask everyone to visit our BKFA website as it is better than ever. There is a section devoted to our Achievements which are so many and will reinforce why we exist.

# Rosie Batty and Jay Weatherill to Co-Chair White Ribbon Australia's new Advisory Council

Former Australian of the Year and advocate Rosie Batty and Thrive by Five CEO Jay Weatherill will join White Ribbon Australia as co-chairs of a new Advisory Council. "We are thrilled to have Rosie and Jay onboard to help guide White Ribbon Australia in our work towards an Australia where women and children are free from all forms of men's violence and abuse," White Ribbon Executive Director Brad Chilcott said.

"I am delighted to join White Ribbon as co-chair of its newly appointed Advisory Council and to share this responsibility with Jay. I believe the expertise, vision and passion that is shared amongst the Council will be an invaluable resource to White Ribbon and I really look forward to what we will be able to achieve," Ms Batty said.

"The task ahead of us is enormous," Mr Weatherill said. "One woman a week is murdered by her current or former male partner, sexual harassment and abuse remains widespread and women's specialist safety services are reporting increasing demand for their support."

White Ribbon Australia Executive Director Brad Chilcott said the appointment of Rosie Batty and Jay Weatherill to these key roles was testament to the organisation's renewed focus on mobilising and supporting communities across Australia to take real, direct action, to eliminate men's violence against women. White Ribbon Australia had been working closely with Ms Batty and Mr Weatherill on a number of projects and key advocacy initiatives over the past 12 months.

"Formalising this alliance and bringing together the key values we share will create a raft of new opportunities to support and build-on the great work being done by people and organisations in communities across Australia.

"This includes the <u>Thrive by Five campaign</u>, headed-up by Mr Weatherill, calling for high quality, easily accessible and affordable early childhood education, to help build economic empowerment, model healthy relationships and advance gender equality.

"Increasing a woman's access to early childhood education for her children can help them navigate a way out of a violent or abusive relationship and access employment opportunities and financial independence.

"That's why White Ribbon Australia has thrown its support behind the Thrive by Five national campaign for universal, accessible, affordable early childhood education," Mr Chilcott said. The inaugural Advisory Council is part of White Ribbon Australia's new approach under the custodianship of Communicare.
