


As this will be our last Newsletter before Christmas, I hope you all have a safe and happy time spent with family and friends. And that 2023 is kind to us all.

Orange Ladies to light up Blackwood 25 November to 10 December

Our Advocacy team have been busy churning out lots of little orange ladies lately.

The support from Businesses in Blackwood to host a 'little orange lady' and use orange as a theme in their shops has been incredible this year. The public will notice lots of orange in the shops from 25th November to 10th December. These dates mark the 16 Days of Activism for the Prevention of Violence against Women.

The orange ladies have been made from recycled Core flute advertising banners and many are modelled on actual local women who have agreed to be represented in silhouette form. They represent just some of the role's women play in our community. We have women in a hard hat, painting a wall, with a baby, in business suits, leading Yoga, singing and flying balloons amongst others.

Dylan Dyer of Akkerman's Blackwood Bakery is preparing orange doughnuts again this year. Demand for them was strong last year so it is recommended that you get into the bakery early each day if you want to score one. Many businesses in the row of shops surrounding Akkerman's have come onboard this year so there will be a lot of orange to look for at 183 Main Road, Blackwood.

The displays range from one orange lady and a poster to themed shop displays and lighting in orange. There are larger displays in offices including the corner window of the Mitcham Council, Harris Real Estate, Kalyra Community office and Catherine Hutchesson's MP Waite office. The Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills has a complete list of the participating businesses on its website and will also be posting a daily thought on facebook to raise awareness and provide education around the issue of genderbased violence.

Domestic Abuse does not discriminate, both men and women from all walks of life become victims. However, the great majority are women and girls and while this terrible imbalance remains, campaigns such as the '16 Days' are needed to raise awareness and promote cultural change. The statistics are still stubbornly stuck on an average of one woman a week in Australia who are killed due to Domestic Violence. Many more women are inhibited from living a safe and productive life due to abuse, including coercive control.

The highlight of the 16 Days campaign will be a Vigil to honour and remember women who have died because of domestic abuse, which will be held on 1 December at sunset at Windy Point, 8:00 – 8:45pm. Please encourage your friends to come along, it will not be a very long event at 30-40 minutes duration. Mayor, Heather Holmes-Ross will be amongst the speakers and musicians to be involved in the candle lit remembrance activities. It is an opportunity to join with others to pay respect and feel the strength and unity that the campaign inspires. A coat and hat are recommended to be worn. If bad weather is expected the event will be cancelled. We will post notice if this is the case by 4pm on the day on facebook - Zontaclubofadelaidehills and website at, www.zontaadelaidehills.org.au





If your identity is stolen:

File a report at the <u>Australian Cyber Security</u> <u>Centre</u>

Contact the three major Australian **credit reporting agencies**; <u>Equifax</u>, <u>Illion</u> and <u>Experian</u>, and obtain a free copy of your credit file.

Place a **ban on your credit file** with those agencies, this can stop criminals accessing credit in your name.

Advise your bank and review your security arrangements. Update your online banking, email and other **passwords** — use unique passwords for each account.

Set up **multi-factor authentication** - where possible don't just use SMS, use something like an authenticator app.

This is to limit the damage done by <u>SIM swaps</u> and phone porting.

Monitor your phone closely - <u>if it suddenly</u> stops working it may have been ported.

Contact <u>IDcare</u> — they have trained counsellors who can support you.


