This has now led to us conducting a month's trial with the Cardiac Suite 2 at Ashford where they are using the cushions for relief for patients following Video-assisted Laparoscopy surgery. So far, we are receiving very positive feedback.

Only a short time now until the Bunbury Conference which I'm looking forward to travelling to with Joy O'Hazy and Julie Monis-Ivett. You have all been provided with the summary paper on all items to be decided at the Conference. Joy will be representing the Club as our delegate. A beautiful game but unequal pay for women

For life-long football fans such as myself the Women's World Cup has been an exciting time. We have watched the Beautiful Game played by fit, skilful, well trained professional young women. They represent a microcosm of society today, successful working women, single mums, players in same sex relationships, migrant Australians. Their achievements have resulted in record TV ratings and full stadiums of men and women, boys and girls, giving the message to Australian politicians and big business that football is a growth sport. Both sides of politics are now promising more funds for community infrastructure to encourage grassroots football and invest in young people. Currently junior football is more expensive for families than rugby or AFL due to less sponsorship and sparse government funding. The Matilda football mania will surely change all that for the better.

What a change in attitudes since the 1960s. I grew up in the great football nation of England but my Yorkshire Dad did not think it suitable to take his daughter with him to Bradford City matches, nor Yorkshire cricket matches. I had to watch football on TV with him and play hockey and netball at school.

Unfortunately, there is a big fight looming for equal pay for equal athletes. Men's World Cup prizemoney is \$64.56 million for Champions, women's is only \$6.59 m. Third place is \$4.01m for women but \$41.59m for men. The training salaries are low. Does this mean that only women with supportive family can play professionally? In which case we are overlooking talented less fortunate players for our national teams.

The Diamonds (national netball team), Women's Cricket Ashes Team have also done us proud and deserve equal reward for the dedication and hours of training required to achieve medals and world recognition for Australia. There is a general recognition nowadays that men and women should have equal pay for equal work. The Matildas have shown that women athletes can capture the nation. Let the political game begin!


