An Evening with Valerie Browning

On Monday 18th March, I was lucky to meet and listen to the inspiring Valerie Browning.

For those who are unfamiliar, Valerie is an Australian nurse who has lived in Ethiopia among the Afar nomads for over 30 years. She founded the Afar Pastoral Development Association, and her family funded the Barbara May Hospital in Ethiopia.

Others may know Valerie from her association with the Birthing Kits, which are used as part of her association's work to improve maternal and child health outcomes.

Valerie is currently touring Australia with the assistance of Birthing Kit Foundation and Ethiopia Aid to raise awareness and financial support for the Afar people who are experiencing significant hardship as a result of drought, famine and conflict, which has led to malnutrition and increased mortality in birthing mothers and children.

One of the highlights of her talk gave us insight into the cultural traditions of the Afar people which include practices dating back to the times of Egyptian pharaohs.

Here are some fascinating takeaways from her talk:

- The Afar people are blessed with high morality, they do not accept disrespectful language or behaviours such as lying. Women are highly respected, and it is not acceptable to touch a woman or ask her personal questions unless she raises the topic herself.
- The Society is governed by Clan Leaders who are responsible for the community's rules and practices. These leaders are actively working together and, with their communities, to stop traditions that cause harm. Valerie and her association have been integral in bringing together these leaders to learn and discuss practice changes.
- Female genital mutilation (FGM) and early marriage of girls at ages of 14-15 are cultural
 practices which originated as forms of protection. The Clan leaders are actively
 supporting the end of FGM as a cultural practice because they do not want to cause
 harm.
- When a Clan Leader rules that a practice should not be done, and a community member disobeys this rule, they are punished. This can involve the loss of goats or more significantly, being shamed, which is very damaging to an Afar person.

One of the threats to the changes that Valerie has helped support is the breakdown of the education system, without ongoing education, bad health practices are at risk of reemerging. As a result of conflict, schools closed in 2021 and some have not reopened, other issues include having the wrong curriculum and disengaged teachers, leading to a vast majority of students not passing year 12 exams and others missing out on the opportunity to learn to read and write.

An Evening with Valerie Browning continued

Listening to Valerie share her story and the story of the Afar people is a vital reminder of our need to be considerate and thoughtful of the global community, as Valerie stated during her talk, 'the world is not limited to Adelaide or Australia, it has greater diversity, and this diversity needs to be protected or we risk losing valuable knowledge of how to care for the land. The Afar people are at risk of extinction'.

We can support Valerie's work through donations to Birthing Kits Foundation who fund the education of birth assistants and the production of birthing kits, also to Ethiopiaid https://ethiopiaid.org.au/

In the next newsletter I will share how Valerie and her association are working to end the six cultural practices that cause harm to birthing mothers and children.

Birthing Kit Project Workshop at Convention

I thought that club members may like some explanation about how come we are holding 2 Birthing Kit workshops at Convention and not presenting the Resolution that was supported at Conference.

Background: The Ambassadorial Committee was established in 2023 to help facilitate the recognition of Zonta by the BKFA. This committee had 3 current Zonta District Governors, 3 BKFA Ambassadors, BKFA Patron PIP Val Sarah, Past D22 Governor Bridget Mather, BKFA Chairperson and Zontian Jenny Weaver, BKFA Director and Zontian Julie Monis-Ivett (Chairperson), and Adrian Harris BKFA Business and Operations Manager. We represent strong Zontians all dedicated to the birthing kit project.

From this group came a recommendation for the Resolution below that was presented at the 3 District Conferences "That Zonta International and the Zonta Foundation for Women support the Birthing Kit Foundation Australia's work in supplying clean birthing kits and education projects into developing countries for the biennium 2024–2026.

Once passed at Conference this was presented to Zonta International by the District Governors.

The Ambassadorial Committee was given clear direction in January from ZI that we could not present a Resolution to Convention AND have a workshop as it would give an air of campaigning for a cause.

The committee then decided that the best way forward was to hold a workshop this year and present the Resolution into the future. The purpose of the workshop is to expose as many Zontians as is possible to the simplicity of assembling birthing kits and the impact of them in a presentation, to enthuse them to join us on this journey.

Very generously the Convention committee allocated two workshops times on Thurs 27 June, 9:00 – 10:30 and 1:30 – 3:00 in the large mezzanine room which can hold easily 200 - 300 at a session. We will need to assemble at least 5000 kits. To help facilitate this we have asked that clubs book their BK Assembly Days to be held at the Convention **as soon as is possible**, at the latest before May 16th. We need club support to assemble around 2,500 kits per workshop. Can I thank our Board for passing a recommendation to have our assembly day for 1200 kits at the Convention – so much appreciated. We have asked Zontians who wish to volunteer at the workshop to book when registering.

Expect Respect Project Workshop at Convention

You may not be aware but our club is no ordinary Zonta club – we punch well above our weight. We have 2 projects from our club being presented at the Convention workshops – both rated highly by the Convention committee. There are many disappointed clubs who were rejected.

In 2014 at the ZI Convention, the Expect Respect project won 4th prize for a project that addresses violence against women at a club level. Bev will be there to fly the flags for the Expect Respect project – it would be lovely if she had more support.

For those who have not made up their minds whether to go to Convention or not, do know it is an inspirational time to see Zonta members world-wide and all the colour and pageantry of the beautiful clothes. You meet the most interesting and committed Zontians - some become best friends. You get to know why we are part of an international organisation and the nuts and bolts on how it functions - which I love.
