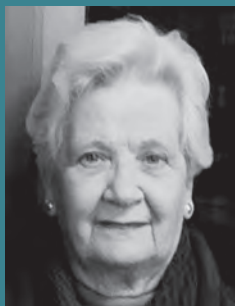

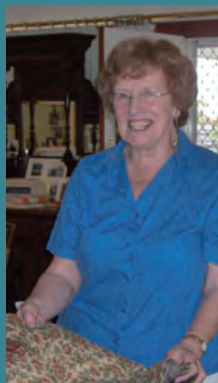

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my great pleasure to summarise the 2017/ 2018 Zonta year for our club. The year began for me with the Handover dinner in May at which the new Board was sworn in by Area Director Pru Blackwell and Vice Director Leanne Symonds. Since then I have enjoyed a very busy and rewarding year.

The speakers at the Handover dinner were Matt Anderson (General Manager of the Birthing Kit Foundation) and our own Janet Ayliffe-Ash who gave a cameo of her interesting life and art. Janet set the scene for many wonderful and inspirational talks from our members as we heard from Di Bartel and Doone Winnall on their life journeys as well. Our club overflows with passionate women and it was a highlight of the year for me when Jill Heylen rose to speak on "Standing Up for Our Sisters". Her clarity of vision and persuasive argument resulted in a unanimous vote to wholeheartedly support the Bill about to be read in Parliament to finally decriminalise Sex work in South Australia.

This deplorably out of date and discriminatory legislation is precisely why Zonta is still so relevant in today's society. I took great pleasure in sending our supportive letter to the relevant politicians.

Our activities began with a big bang with a Birthing Kit Assembly day at the Blackwood Community Centre at which we celebrated the Two Millionth kit to be made. Our gratitude goes to the Birthing Kit Foundation for supporting this event and coming along in numbers to share the milestone with us. Doone was featured in an article in the local press about how our club began the initiative all those years ago. Early in the year we revamped the Bulletin under the new newsletter editor, Margaret Bunfield. She has worked very hard at creating what is now a great resource for the club and visitors to our website, so much so that we felt the need to change the title to ZAH News as it now is way too big for a bulletin! It has been great to see more articles of interest in the news and we now have an up to date 'Save the Date' for everyone to access. With the celebration of the 125th anniversary of South Australian women winning the right to vote and stand for Parliament this year we had lots of incentive to add some history to our news articles.

This was also the motivation for Joy O'Hazy to research and put together no less than five talks and a walking tour based on the theme. She has been working on this for a good part of the year and will present them during History month in May this year. We are so lucky to have people like Joy in the club who are prepared to follow their own initiatives through to creating something we can all enjoy. Please read the next ZAH News for the details!

We enjoyed many good guest speakers over the year thanks to the Membership, PR and Programming committee. The work output of this committee was tremendous as they also largely managed our functions, membership coordination, the website and other PR. Thank you to Sherry for again supporting the club by getting the website out to the public and keeping our posters up to date, it is such a significant part of our promotion and information sharing. All of these details are recorded in this Annual report by Coordinator Sharon Geue. I thank Sharon and all of the committee for a year of hard work and dedication which has included the majority of the responsibility for fundraising this year. Their work has put us in a very good position financially and has enabled to commit to all of our ongoing projects this year.

Changes

One important change that we made as a club this year was to reorganise our planning and budget period. This came about from the evaluation work completed last year under the leadership of Lynda A'Bear. I was proud to be the President as the club worked together to firstly identify what we can do in our local context to support the Zonta International biennium goals; and secondly to restructure our calendar to ensure we are organised and funded at the beginning of the calendar year to start work on our commitments. I hope that this new arrangement will reap benefits as we learn to work to a new planning schedule.

SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

Once again the Service Committee of Judy Little, Lorna Caire, Margaret Parsons, Barbara Wadell-Smith, Irene Kiroff, Joy O'Hazy, Janet Ayliffe-Ash, Anne Fuller and myself, Jill Heylen, completed a most satisfactory, although a slightly different but happy year with less money at our disposal.

Having gained less money from fund raising than anticipated and with costs going up, our budget for our projects was reduced. This was to ensure that the club's future position would be financially secure.

We used the time now available to the committee on workshops. We made 'Days for Girls' menstrual liners, shields and bags and breast cushions for women recovering from breast operations. This enabled 123 breast cushions beautifully gift wrapped to be delivered to the most appreciative woman at Ashford and Modbury hospitals.

Thanks to the generous hospitality of Janet Ayliffe-Ash, Joy O'Hazy, Barbara Wadell-Smith and Margaret Parsons, these workshops were a "joy".

Club Projects

I Caire Bags

Due to a government review of the Adelaide Women's Domiciliary Violence Refuge Centre, it was moved to the Eastern Area. It caters for women of all nationalities including Australian, Aboriginal, migrants, refugees and their children. From here the 'I Caire Bags' are distributed when the women and children are moved from there to emergency housing.

Lorna Caire and Jill Heylen purchased a range of toiletry products accompanied by activity materials for children and 18 bags were collected from Lorna for distribution.

Getting Started Buckets

Irene Kiroff once again did a most efficient and needless to say, superb job of following sales publicity advertising to acquire the best value for money with the items purchased. She filled 25 'getting started buckets'. These were for young girls and women between the ages of 13 and 19 often with very young children refuging at "Louise Place" temporarily for security while learning and gaining survival skills, they were then moved into new housing.

I would like to thank most sincerely our wonderful service committee for the love, care and commitment they give to our projects. Always being acutely aware of the needy people who will be receiving them. I must also give a deeply felt thank you to those club members who are not on the service committee and yet find time in their busy lives to support its projects. You are invaluable.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECTS REPORT

Birthing Kits

Our Birthing Kit Assembly Day coordinator Amanda Waldock in conjunction with Julie Monis-Ivett and the Birthing Kit Foundation(BKF) organised an Assembly day on June 16th. It was an important event as we celebrated the making of the Two Millionth kit. The BKF honoured our club as the originators of the project with a cake. Many members of the BKF attended the day along with Zontians from other clubs. In total 2,000 Kits were put together to meet the milestone on a cold and wet Saturday with a fabulous number of volunteers who came along to help.

Earlier in the year, in May, 600 kits were assembled by the year 9 girls of St John Grammar School, Belair. This was organised by Kylie whose daughter is a leader at that school and the fundraising to purchase the equipment and postage was done as part of the "Rite Journey" program that is run at the school. Amanda assisted Doone to organise, prepare and run the event on the day.

We have been fortunate in having Diane Strutton in our club with her connection to the Cairns Zonta Club as this year that club was looking for a partner work with on Birthing Kits. They were willing to provide the funding for the assembly of 400 Birthing Kits. We were very pleased to be able to provide the organisation and labour to do that and this assembly day will take place on June 1st, 2019. The Club has also committed funds to produce another 400 Kits. We hope to make the Assembly days, or half days a vehicle for promoting our club and Zonta to prospective members and new supporters. This will mean we will be looking to promote Birthing Kit events widely within our community in the future.

Days for Girls

Margaret Parsons has continued to coordinate the making of Days for Girls packs this year. The Days for Girls group work together across Adelaide to support each other and collaborate to get all of the many components assembled for the packs. This includes cutting waterproof material and cotton fabrics to very specific specifications; sourcing fabric; sewing the shields and liners as well as making draw string bags to put the kits into. Our members have worked with great ingenuity and cooperation to provide the end product which is a kit that girls can take with them anywhere during their menstrual days to enable them to participate in activities many of us take for granted.

This year 197 bags and 187 shields were completed, plus many, many flannelette strips have been overlocked ready for completion.

Since our club joined the SA chapter of Days for Girls International in November 2013, we have sewn 915 bags, 1141 shields and 4250 liners. A mighty effort, thank you everyone. Thanks to this work girls in developing countries get the chance to participate in school, education and work without discrimination.

Amanda Waldock has taken over the organisation of our Birthing Kit assembly days. We celebrated the two millionth birthing kit at our assembly in June of last year amid huge celebrations with the birthing Kit Foundation.

Margaret Granger has taken over the membership list and continues to keep the membership booklets up to date and present all new members with a booklet with Zonta information and members details in it. We have also put together an information folder for anyone interested in joining our club.

Our Guest Speakers this year have included Jenny Horne from the Beacon Emergency Relief church group here in Blackwood who provide care for local individuals and families and whom we have been supporting with food packs. After the Japan Conference we had Doone and Lynda report on the conference and the projects that had been adopted by Zonta International. Calandra Scott from the Cancer Care Support Group at Unley spoke about the services available to people with cancer. 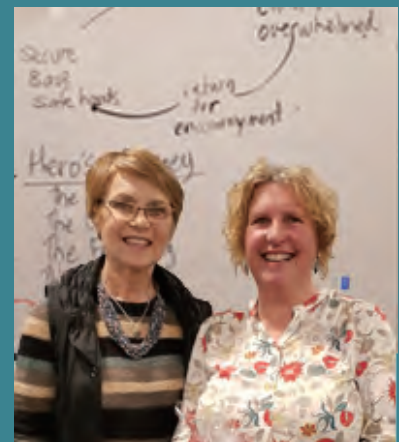

Advocacy Committee Report

It has been a very enjoyable, successful and productive year for the Advocacy Committee, with the team pulling together to enable us to achieve our objectives, while strengthening our friendships along the way. We continued to build on our relationships with our partners in the Expect Respect Project and to represent our club at other events which advocate for women's rights.

The Expect Respect Project was run for Years 4 and 5 in the Mount Barker South Primary School and the Mount Barker Primary School in the third and fourth terms. This year the workshops were run by S.C. Libby Bruce from Mount Barker Police and Vina Hotich from CAMHS. The elements of the workshop are designed to promote an awareness of what constitutes respectful relationships as well as practical safety strategies: empowering women and girls, religious cultural and ethnic diversity, different types of bullying, the rights of the child, the age of criminal responsibility in Australia, strategies to stay safe, support others, and how to access help.

Meetings were held with all stakeholders prior to the workshops, and the children produced artwork that reflected the lessons learned in the workshops.. The advocacy committee arranged and executed the two-week display of the children's artwork in the Mount Barker Council Public Library, which culminated in the community event. This event was held at the Library in partnership with White Ribbon and garnered extensive favourable media coverage both before and after the event. It was well attended by students from both schools, representative senior students from Cornerstone College and St Francis de Sales, community leaders, and members of the wider community.

We continued our pro-active approach to securing funding through grant applications and by speaking directly to donors. This year The Expect Respect Project received donations from The Mount Barker Anglican Mothers Union, and Mount Barker Council.

We continue to represent the club at various events which advocate for women, including White Ribbon, International Women's Day events, forums on decriminalisation of sex workers, and Amelia Earhart events, as well as attendance at the Combined Advocacy Meetings. We have joined the National Council for Women S A as an affiliate organisation, with Amanda and Di as delegates. This gives us an opportunity to coordinate and connect with like-minded organisations working to empower women.

Jane liaised with both the Mount Barker Primary School and Mount Barker South Primary School to identify a child who fitted the criteria for the Kristina Macaulay Award which is given annually. This prize was presented to a student from each school at their end of year assembly.

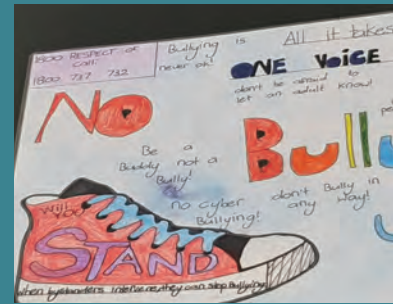

Treasurer's Report

Zonta Club of the Adelaide Hills Treasurer's Report for year ended 31st March 2019

I am pleased to present the unaudited Financial Statements for the year 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019 for the Zonta Club of the Adelaide Hills Inc

We have had a successful year from your fundraising, raising in excess of \$11,500 to support our International, D23 and local projects., as well as \$410 to support the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Fund. Our fundraising activities this year included 2 Sausage Sizzles, 2 Movie events and a Quiz night, with members raising further funds through wine sales and 10 to 100 activities.

Our activities have included 2 'Birthing Kit Assembly Days', the provision and assembly of 'I Caire Bags' for victims of domestic violence, 'Buckets of Love' for Louise Place, 'Breast Care Cushions' for women recovering from breast cancer and items for the 'Days for Girls' project. Our 'Expect Respect' project was again supported by the Anglican Mothers Union and saw students from the two Mt Barker schools being awarded funds from the Kristina Macauley legacy fund. We were able to provide loans to 12 women in 8 countries through our 'Kiva' project.

One third of the funds raised in 2018-2019, together with those raised for the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Fund will be sent to ZI International to support the Zonta International Service Projects.
