From the President

It has been an exciting month with history in the making at Parliament. The Bill to Decriminalise Sex Work passing in the Legislative Council.

The Bill had a second reading on June 5th after a year or so lagging. It almost got through that evening, but it had to have some amendments to make it more likely to pass. I woke late last week to hear on ABC radio that well into the wee hours of the morning it was again debated and this time it passed! So now it's approved by the Legislative Council and will be introduced into the lower house (House of Assembly) later in the year. Wouldn't it just be a fairytale ending if it was finally passed in this year of the 125th anniversary of our State granting Votes for Women and the right to stand for Parliament AND our Zonta 100 year celebration! We will again be sending our letter of support to all MP's in the lower house before it is introduced there. No doubt there will be another opportunity to witness history in the making when the Bill is debated again later this year.

It has been a great month for the club with lots of activity and work being done. As you will see in this newsletter Louise Place buckets have been packed and donated and some members have attended a Days for Girls assembly day as well. We've held another Birthing Kit Assembly Day where Julie gave a stirring talk and we met a whole bunch of young women interested in the work we do. In fact one lady I met, Fiona has been able to donate a whole swag of fabrics which I picked up this week from her dad Don. We will be able to use some for Days for Girls, Breast Care Cushions and rugs. A lot will go to DR Congo for greatly needed sewing of

clothes, school uniforms and furnishings.

I am looking forward to working with members on Joy's history talk material to make an entertaining performance by our club at the Centennial Dinner. All those interested will be invited to workshop the ideas and words over the next few months. I've also been involved in the Women's Safety pilot project with other Area 2 members. My task is to consult on the visual representation of a power point which will form part of a presentation tool for Zontians to deliver awareness raising talks on women's safety. This is not the only tool to be created but it's the first thing which is being developed and trailed in the District and our Area has volunteered to get it ready to show the District at some stage soon...

Progress has been made on the making of the Orange Ladies with a quote coming in from one of my contacts in the display world. I will now work on perfecting 3 body shapes that will be simple to cut out and hopefully have a prototype for those who wish to cut one out for themselves. I hope to have a visual to show everyone at the meeting this week.

At Board we decided to make a regular date for the walking group, so we thought that the 2nd Sunday of Every Other Month starting in July would be good. Feedback and ideas for walks are welcome.

Thank you Sharon for getting on with some plans for fundraising. I urge everyone to get behind her and support our fund raising as that is the most significant way we can make a difference to women and support the growth of confident girls in our community. We can certainly pressure and work for social change but it's those dollars spent that are also very important and make a difference on the ground.

Birthing Kit Assembly Day held Saturday 1st June 2019

Every woman has the right to a clean and safe childbirth. Annually around 300,000 women and 3 million newborns die each year from preventable causes related to pregnancy and childbirth. The Birthing Kit Foundation is dedicated to improving the lives of women who are giving birth in developing countries.

On Saturday 1st June we held our 2019 Birthing Kit Assembly Day at St Peter's Lutheran Church in Blackwood. 2019 marks the 20th Anniversary of the Birthing Kit project which commenced in the Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills. We welcomed Nicole Marshall, the new Business Management and Marketing Manager of the Birthing Kit Foundation, to her first Assembly Day.

The funding to make the Birthing Kits was performed in conjunction with the Zonta Club of Cairns and we put together 800 birthing kits which will be distributed internationally. Our wonderful volunteers put in a lot work to get the kits done prior to enjoying a fabulous afternoon tea and a delicious cake to mark the milestone.

Dr Julie Monis-Ivett OAM gave a presentation outlining why Zonta and the Birthing Kits are so important, the immense value and the difference they have made to women around the world.

If like me, you were very impressed with Fiona MacFadyen's presentation at the last dinner meeting, on the work of Second Chances targeting a group of people we often forget or know nothing about. I would like to give the details again as to how we can assist.

They have an Op Shop at 397 Diagonal Road, Sturt. It is open Monday to Friday 9.30 am to 4.30 pm and on Saturdays from 10 am to 3.00 pm. The Op Shop takes household goods, affordable furniture as well as clothing (men's, women's and children's), shoes, bric-a-brac, crockery, kitchen utensils, Manchester, books and bedding. Apart from raising money to support the children of prisoners, these goods help the homeless and victims of domestic violence. They will accept electrical goods. As these are not accepted by many charities, this is great.

The furniture store is at 131 Richmond Road, Richmond. Second Chances will pick up furniture from you. Phone: 8352 7722.


Getting Started Buckets
